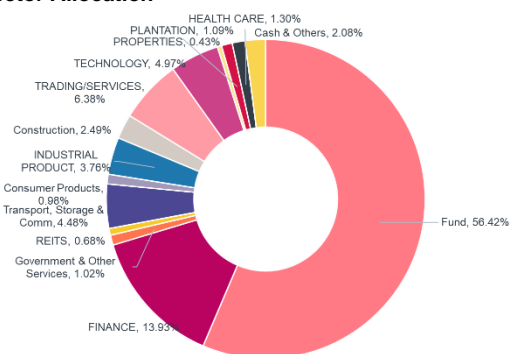

Sector Allocation



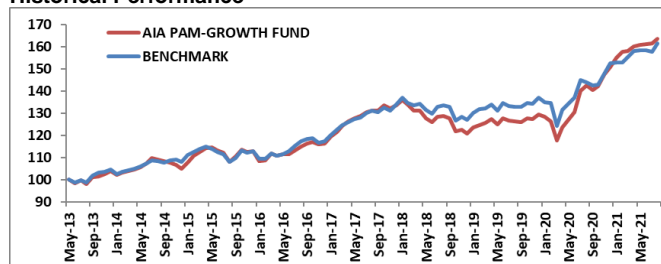
Risk

Market Review

Malaysian Government Securities ("MGS") yield curve bear-flattened in Aug 2021 as domestic political scene dominated headlines during the month. Market sentiment improved after the new Prime Minister announced his cabinet line-up, which comprised of multiple cabinet ministers being reappointed, pointing to a continuity in government policies. On the currency front, MYR strengthened by 1.74% against the greenback to close the month at MYR4.1482.

The FBKMLCI ("Index") rose by 7.1% Month-on-Month ("MoM") to close at 1,601.38 pts on 30 August 2021. The Index outperformed the MSCI Asia Ex Japan Index, which dropped by 1.3 MoM in Malaysian ringgit ("MYR") terms over the same period. In August 2021, foreign investors turned net buyers of RM1 bn of Malaysian equities while local institutional investors were the largest net sellers of RM1.5 bn. The Asian equities market was weak during the month due to the Delta variant outbreaks across the region. Meanwhile, MSCI World was up +0.9% MoM in MYR terms after the US Fed's reassuring comments that it is in no hurry to raise interest rates, even though it considers tapering bond purchases this year.

Market Outlook

Given the two-speed recovery in the developed markets against emerging markets, we expect the former to lead in terms of policy tightening. Bank Negara Malaysia's policy measures should remain accommodative in the near term. Higher supply of sovereign bonds should be well absorbed by the market, as we expect the additional supply to be concentrated at the short to belly of the curve.

We remain optimistic of the local equity market given the positive development in the daily vaccination trend and some near-term clarity over the domestic politics with the appointment of our new Prime Minister and cabinet line-up. Downside risks to the market could stem from new Covid-19 variants and uncertainties from the domestic political landscape.

On foreign equities, given the economic recovery is partially reflected in the equity market, investors are currently watching the macro data closely to gauge the strength of inflationary pressure and the timing of a QE tapering.
